## Ready to Learn:

In order to support students with their organisation and preparedness for learning we will be selling pens, pencils and rulers in the canteen after Easter at the following cost: Pens – 15p, pencils 10p, rulers 10p all three 30p.

Students will only be able to purchase these items of stationery before school, at break time and during their lunch breaks and they will be paid for through the normal cashless catering system.

We hope that by offering this service we will encourage students to take responsibility for their learning as well as supporting you all with a ready supply of equipment!

## Attendance:

In the interest of safe guarding the students and due to many unauthorised absences at KLA, we will be launching a text messaging programme in the coming weeks. This will inform parents if their child/children have not arrived at school. The message will ask you to contact KLA to let us know why they are absent. To avoid any unnecessary text messages can you please ensure that you contact the school as early as possible if they are ill or have a medical appointment.

We still have a number of students who are arriving late to school. Can you remind your child that school starts at 8.35 with the first bell, where they should be in school and ready to start the lesson. At 8.45 on the second bell, they should all be in the classroom, not just arriving to school. If they arrive after the register as been taken this can also trigger a text message.

This system will use the mobile numbers we already have stored on our system. With this in mind can you make sure that KLA is informed of any new contact numbers or details.

Whole school attendance is 93%.

Year attendance is as follows:

Year 7	94%
Year 8	94%
Year 9	94%
Year 10	92%
Year 11	92%

Well done to Year 7, 8 and 9 for remaining at the top.

We had over 340 students with good attendance in the past 4 weeks. 306 if those had 100% attendance. Great news, keep it coming.

KLA are monitoring students with 90% attendance and below. I shall be meeting with students whose attendance is causing us concern and with parents if attendance does not improve. Students are at risk of missing out if they do not have regular attendance. Parents are at risk of a fine if there are no genuine reasons given for their child's absence. Even if there is a genuine reason for your child being off sick, please be mindful of the amount of time they may be missing from school. 90% attendance means that they have had missed 20 school days a year. That's 4 weeks of education they have missed.

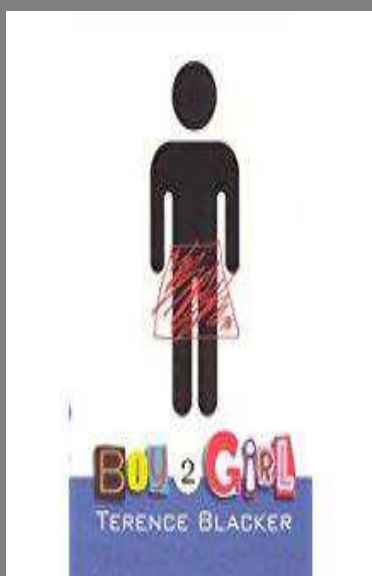
## KLA Library:

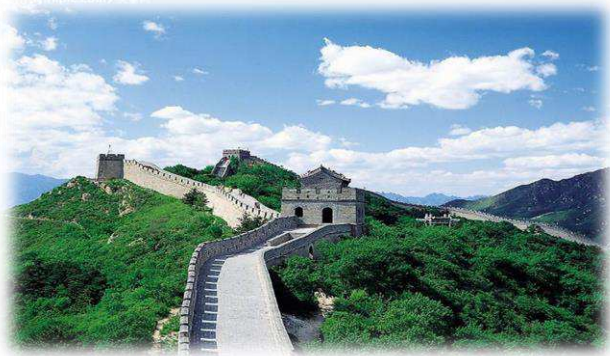
### Year 11
