#### **WEEK 5 ANSWERS:**

There are four faces that are the same size as the unshaded ones, and two that are the same as the shaded face.

Since each unshaded face is four times the size of the shaded one, the surface area of the cuboid is  $(4\times4)+(2\times1)=18$  times the area of the shaded face.

Since this total area is  $72 \text{cm}^2$ , the shaded face has area  $72 \text{cm}^2 \div 18 = 4 \text{cm}^2$ .

Each unshaded face therefore has area 4cm<sup>2</sup>×4= 16cm<sup>2</sup>.
