Attendance:

Whole school attendance is 93.3%. We are slowly heading in the right direction to meet our target.

Well done to Year 7, 8 and 9. Top of the leader board, keep up the great work!

Thank you for your support with the Attendance Coffee. Although many parents did not attend, those that I had conversations with found it useful and now understand a little more about how poor attendance can make a difference in the long term to their child's education.

Students can miss out on a whole GCSE grade in the future if their attendance stays between 85 and 90%. Norfolk County Council are now monitoring students with 90% attendance and below and it is now classed as Persistent Absenteeism. Parents are at risk of a fine if there are no genuine reasons given for their child's absence. Even if there is a genuine reason for your child being off sick, please be mindful of the amount of time they may be missing from school. 90% attendance means that they have had missed 20 school days a year. That's 4 weeks of education missed.
