## Year 9 Injection:

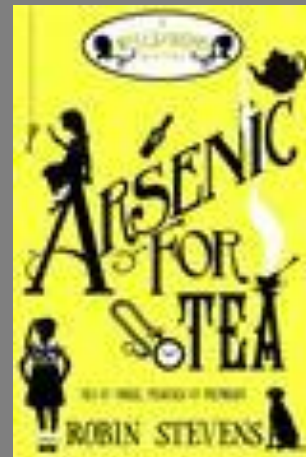
