Well done Year 7. Keep up the good work.

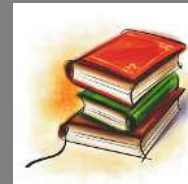
We have 360 students with good attendance 95% and above since September 2017. Well done! Out of those, 33 students still have 100% attendance.

The 'Genre of the Fortnight' continues to be historical fiction. Books on our display include –

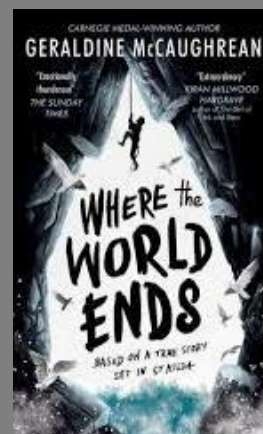

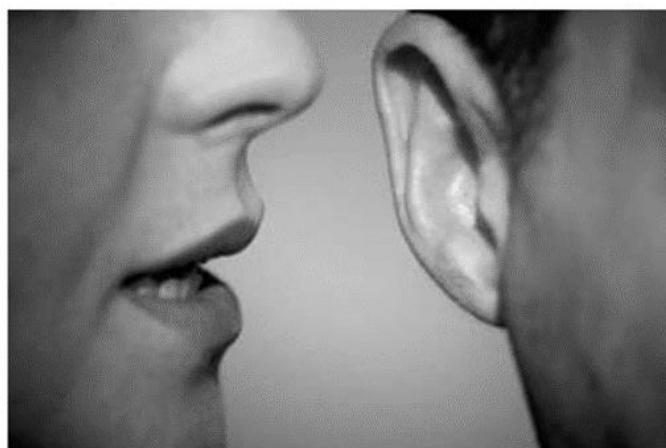
